NEW Program Priorities

NEW Program Eligibility

The NEW Program supports organizations that:

- Are a 501(c)(3) or fiscally sponsored
- Have a \$10,000 minimum annual budget
- Are located in the Bay Area, with priority given to those in San Francisco & Oakland
- Are grounded in dance and/or theater





NEW Program Grant Requirements

- Projects must have a public presentation
- Grant request amounts must be between \$5,000 \$30,000
- We commit to funding no less than 70% of the requested amount for selected projects
- At least 50% of grant funds must be allocated to artist fees & direct expenses
- Remaining grant funds are unrestricted to the applicant organization
- Performances must have production dates after Jan 1, 2025



NEW Program Criteria Explanations

New and Experimental	New work is not fully developed or has not been presented in the Bay Area. Experimental work is innovative or cutting edge.
Boundary Pushing	Projects that expand the boundaries of dance and/or theater and support artists advancing their own practice.
Relevant and Timely	Projects that address timely and compelling issues relevant to the artists and communities they intend to serve.
Community Connection	Projects that consider, reflect and/or meaningfully connect to the unique communities they seek to serve.

- Review our <u>frequently asked questions</u>, which include criteria explanations and the evaluation process to help assess project alignment.
- Strong applications directly and succinctly address all core criteria, explaining how the project pushes boundaries, is relevant and timely and has strong community connection.
- The most helpful work samples relate to the work being proposed, showcase recent work & show continuous excerpts (avoid highlight reels).
